Simple Steps to getting married at St Mary, Kippington

Step One: Your enquiry to the church office allowed the possibility of getting married at this church.

Step Two: Upon confirmation and agreement of date by email, the Team Rector takes the opportunity to meet with you personally, either at the Church or via Zoom.

Step Three: Attendance of an evening wedding preparation session to explore all the different options available to you for your wedding at St Mary Kippington and the order of service and practicalities.

Step Four: If one or both of you are living outside the parish of St Mary Kippington then you need to have your Banns of Marriage read at your local church over three consecutive Sundays. We will always help you with this.

Step Five: Your Banns of Marriage will also be read at St Mary Kippington over three consecutive Sundays. We do all of this for you.

Step six: Remember to pay for your wedding at least a couple of weeks beforehand – we offer you the facility of paying by instalments, or by bank transfer, as well as by cheque.

Step Seven: All the people with roles at your wedding, come together for a rehearsal at the Church a few days before your wedding.

Step Eight: Your wedding day!
